Project Name: Uplift Digital Capability

Training Package: BSB Business Services Training Package

Introduction

FSO’s Workforce Plan 2025 – Pathways to Impact highlights the urgent need to strengthen digital capability across the Australian workforce, recognising it as essential for economic growth, workforce adaptability, and lifelong learning. Employers across industries consistently identify digital skills gaps as a barrier to productivity and mobility, underscoring the need for a stronger national baseline. Evidence shows that portable, generalist digital Units of Competency (UoCs) could provide a recognised benchmark for capability that applies across sectors, enabling workers to transition more easily between roles and industries, while supporting individuals to thrive in work, learning, and life.

This work builds on the outcomes of the Qualifications Reform Demonstration Project (QRDG), which tested new approaches to qualification design. The reform process identified that alongside occupation-specific qualifications, there is a need for transferable or “Purpose 3” training products that support skills development across industries.

The proposed development of new digital capability, generalist AI, and cyber security Units of Competency responds directly to these reform priorities. It anticipates training products that are flexible, portable, and scalable across the VET system, while providing a consistent national benchmark for digital competence.

There is a clear need for a consistent approach to digital capability development across the education and training system, and this consultation seeks feedback to shape the direction of these anticipated training products.

Scope of the project

This training product development activity will anticipate the creation of:

- digital capability training products, drafted, accredited, and included in the Business Services (BSB) Training Package, providing a consistent and transferable benchmark for digital skills
- new generalist artificial intelligence (AI) training products, to respond to emerging workforce demand across a wide range of industries and occupations
- new or updated generalist cyber security training products, to respond to employer-identified needs for baseline cyber capability across the economy.

This scope reflects the priorities identified through the Qualifications Reform Demonstration Project (QRDG), which emphasised the need for Purpose 3 training products that are transferable across sectors, flexible in delivery, and portable for learners.

The development process will adhere to the **Training Package Organising Framework (TPOF)**, commencing 1 July 2025, ensuring that the new UoCs are consistent with the national approach to training product design, delivery, and compliance.

Website notification

March 2025

Future Skills Organisation will publish a project webpage including the project commencement. At the commencement stage the draft consultation process, and feedback option on the Future Skills Organisation Project website <https://www.futureskillsorganisation.com.au/uplifting-digital-capability>.

Establishment of Technical Committee

April 2025

FSO will provide a link on the project webpage and send an email to key stakeholders seeking expressions of interest for nominations to become a member of the Uplift Digital Capability Technical Committee.

Following the expressions of interest, FSO will establish a Technical Committee to provide expert advice based on evidence across educational and technical knowledge to assist in the design and development of training products.

The Technical Committee will leverage their expertise to advise the FSO on training design, delivery, and assessment, AQF (Australian Qualifications Framework) levels, impacts on learners, implementation issues, and identify any additional stakeholders that should be included in the consultation strategy.

The membership of the Technical Committee will be proportional to the scope of the project.

Notify Senior Responsible Officers, Assurance Body, and other Jobs and Skills Councils

September 2025

Drafting training package products scoping and review

September 2025

Scoping and review of training package products involves evaluating their content, structure, and relevance to ensure they meet both industry and learner needs. This process includes:

- identifying gaps or outdated information,
- aligning with current regulations and workforce requirements, and
- incorporating feedback from stakeholders.

The anticipated new generalist digital capability, AI, and cyber security training products will be scoped against these criteria to ensure they provide a fit-for-purpose national benchmark.

Scoping consultation

Stakeholder engagement and collaboration will be open, proactive, inclusive, fair, and transparent across the VET (Vocational Education and Training) system and industry. Multiple mechanisms will be used to collect feedback to inform the development process. These are designed to maximise participation opportunities and garner a comprehensive range of views and perspectives from stakeholders across Australia.

FSO will engage with members of the consultation group and a wider network of stakeholders through facilitated workshops, individual consultations, and online questionnaires. These mechanisms allow stakeholders to:

- provide input on training design, delivery, and assessment,
- comment on proposed AQF levels,
- identify impacts on learners, and
- flag potential implementation issues

This project's consultation will also build on and extend previous engagement activities, including:

- the Qualifications Reform Demonstration Project (QRDG), which tested new approaches to qualification design and emphasised the need for transferable Purpose 3 training products, and

- the ICT Needs and Gaps Analysis, which identified consistent workforce demand for foundational digital, AI, and cyber skills across multiple industries.

By drawing on these prior consultations, the project ensures continuity, leverages existing evidence, and creates opportunities for stakeholders to validate and refine the direction of the anticipated new training products.

For this project, stakeholders will be able to participate in workshops, one-on-one consultations, and online questionnaires. These activities will enable stakeholders to provide feedback on:

- the design and intent of the anticipated training products,
- options for delivery and contextualisation across different industries,
- approaches to assessment and evidence requirements,
- the proposed alignment to the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) and DigComp 2.2, including progression pathways,
- likely impacts on learners in terms of accessibility, transferability, and progression, and
- potential implementation issues for RTOs and employers.

This consultation will build on and extend earlier engagement undertaken through the Qualifications Reform Demonstration Project and the ICT Needs and Gaps Analysis, while also drawing on recognised frameworks such as DigComp 2.2 to ensure the training products are benchmarked to international standards. This combined approach ensures continuity, leverages existing evidence, and enables stakeholders to validate and refine the direction of the anticipated new UoCs.

Workshops

FSO will host interactive workshops to explore and shape the anticipated Uplift Digital Capability training products. These sessions are designed to bring together a diverse range of stakeholders to exchange ideas, challenge thinking, and provide direct feedback on the draft products.

Workshops will also ensure regional, rural, and remote voices are heard, maximising reach and inclusivity across Australia. Commonwealth, state and territory government stakeholders, along with industry representatives, RTOs, and learner groups, will be invited to participate.

To make the sessions engaging and accessible, FSO will use online collaboration tools to capture real-time input, including perspectives from minority and underrepresented cohorts. This approach ensures every participant has a voice and that a wide range of insights are incorporated into the development process.

Email Feedback

FSO recognises that not all stakeholders can participate in workshops or consultations, so we are also inviting written feedback via email on the anticipated Uplift Digital Capability training products.

This option provides a flexible way for stakeholders to share their insights, raise issues, or highlight opportunities at a time that suits them. All feedback will be reviewed and considered as part of the development process.

Treatment of Feedback

All feedback captured during the consultation period will be reviewed by the Technical Committee for relevance to the anticipated training products. The Technical Committee will apply their expertise to analyse the feedback and determine which suggestions will be incorporated into the products.

Where feedback is not adopted, FSO will provide a clear justification to ensure transparency in the decision-making process.

Scoping Consultation Log

Throughout the development process, feedback will be recorded in a project Consultation Log. This log will provide a high-level summary of stakeholder input and will be published on the project website at key milestones.

The Consultation Log will include:

- evidence of consultation activities,
- summaries of feedback received,
- FSO's responses to feedback,
- justification for feedback not incorporated, and
- details of any unresolved issues or dispute resolution processes.

Publishing the log ensures that the consultation process remains transparent, accountable, and inclusive, giving stakeholders confidence that their contributions have been carefully considered.

Drafting process

September 2025

The drafting process will commence with the scoping and review of the anticipated Uplift Digital Capability qualifications, Units of Competency, and skill sets. This stage will involve evaluating the content, structure, and relevance of the proposed training products to ensure alignment with:

- current and emerging industry needs,
- learner pathways and AQF levels as well as DigComp2.2 Framework, and
- findings from the Qualifications Reform Demonstration Project and the ICT Needs and Gaps Analysis.

A Scoping Report will be developed and considered by the Uplift Digital Capability Technical Committee. Based on the report and committee advice, FSO will commence drafting the Training Package Products.

Draft products will be iteratively reviewed by the Technical Committee to confirm their fitness for purpose, industry relevance, and compliance with the Training Package Organising Framework (TPOF).

Once endorsed by the committee, the draft products will be released for the first round of government and public consultation, ensuring stakeholders across the VET system and industry could provide input.

Technical Committee meetings will be held throughout the project to obtain subject matter expertise (SME) on the draft training products, provide industry advice and recommendations and support for the FSO's Draft Training Package Products.

Release of draft training products

November 2025

The Draft training products will be made available via the FSO project website page including consultation dates and options for providing feedback. The links on the project web page make all drafts publicly available to download for review and comment. The opening of consultation will be promoted through FSO newsletters, email alerts and social media, and reminders will be sent via the same mechanisms during the four-week consultation period.

Undertake Draft 1 consultations

November 2025

Stakeholder engagement and collaboration will be open, proactive, inclusive, fair, and transparent across the VET (Vocational Education and Training) system and industry. Multiple mechanisms will be used to collect feedback to inform the development process. These are designed to maximise participation opportunities and garner a comprehensive range of views and perspectives from stakeholders across Australia.

These facilitated consultations give stakeholders an opportunity to discuss issues as a group and provide their feedback. March to October 2026

Throughout the development process, feedback will be captured in the project Consultation Log. It will include evidence of consultations, responses to feedback, and if relevant any dispute resolution, justification for feedback not incorporated, and issues not resolved.

Incorporating feedback

Determine revisions

December 2025

Information collated from consultations will be analysed to identify potential actions, responses and solutions. These actions, responses and solutions will be developed through regular facilitated processes including advice from the Technical Committee, and where necessary other subject matter experts. The FSO will endeavour to incorporate feedback to ensure the final products reflect a shared RTO (Registered Training Organisations) and Industry view.

Validate revisions

February 2026

The Technical Committee will provide advice on the final draft training products and a statement to this effect forms part of the submission of the final products to the FSO Chief Executive Officer.

Additional consultation if required

February 2026

Stakeholder engagement and collaboration will be open, proactive, inclusive, fair, and transparent across the VET (Vocational Education and Training) system and industry. Multiple mechanisms will be

Provide justification

March 2026

Justification will be provided where consultation feedback is not implemented or broad consensus from stakeholders can not be reached, along with reasons why issues cannot be resolved. Any impact on learners and employment outcomes will be clearly identified.

Dispute resolution

March 2026

Where broad agreement cannot be achieved, the FSO will engage with all relevant stakeholders to facilitate an outcome. Should a formal dispute be raised the FSO will apply the Model Dispute Resolution Policy.

Senior Officials Check

Senior Responsible Officers

April 2026

FSO will provide the final draft training products and consultation log to the Senior Responsible Officers for a final review. During this minimum two-week period feedback provided from the Senior Responsible Officers will be added to the consultation log.

Finalisation and Submission Body and Skills Ministers' Endorsement

Finalisation and Submission

June 2026

Finalisation of Training Package Products and preparation of submission documentation.

Assurance Body and Skills Ministers' Approvals

August 2026

FSO will provide the final draft training products and consultation log to the Assurance Body for a final review. During this period the Assurance Body considers if the process was TPOF complaint. Any feedback provided from the Assurance Body will be responded to and if required the Training Package Products will be updated.

Upon endorsement of the Training Package Products the Assurance Body provides a recommendation to the Skills Ministers'.

The Skills Ministers' review the Training Package Products and either endorse or not endorse the Training Package Products. Non endorsed Training Package Products will require remedial action and resubmission.

Publication of training products

October 2026

The completed and endorsed training products will be released and published on the National Register of VET within 10 days of endorsement. Notification of the release along with the final submission documents will be published on the FSO project website once the release is publicly available.

Key Stakeholders

The FSO will engage with key stakeholders to seek participation and to gather feedback throughout the training product development process. Participation will be sought from the following categories:

- employers and their representatives/peak bodies
- employees and their representatives/unions
