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Project Name: Specialist Artificial Intelligence

Training Package: Information Communications and Technology

Introduction

This training product development activity will update the Information and Communications Technology (ICT) training package with new and urgent training products related to specialist AI. It is anticipated that the new training product will respond to rapid growth in AI adoption, significant skills shortages, and the need for industry-aligned training pathways that enable both employers and workers to access and apply specialist AI skills in a fast-changing sector.

Scope of the project

This activity will update the ICT Training Package with Specialist AI training products based on the findings from the ICT Needs and Gaps Analysis (ICT NGA) and FSO Workforce Plan, in order to:

- Meet Specialist AI skills gaps identified as urgent
- Clearly articulate the purpose of the training products
- Allow for agility and contextualisation
- Include multiple entry and exit points (stackable qualifications)
- Articulate the relationship with industry/vendor certifications
- Clearly identify pathways and job role outcomes, and
- Ensure the ICT training products includes training products that are sustainable.

The following is in scope for the project:

- Adherence to the TPOF process (effective from: 1 July 2025)
- Establishment of the Specialist AI Technical Committee
- Scoping and drafting of Specialist AI training products
- Public and Government consultation of Draft training products
- Review and update of any existing training products identified in the scoping process
- Action any recommendation(s) from scoping report.

1. Initial development

Website notification

May 2025

FSO will publish the project commencement, consultation process, and feedback option on the FSO Project website [Specialist Artificial Intelligence](#).

Establishment of Technical Committee

December 2025

FSO will send an email to key stakeholders seeking nominations to become a member of the Specialist Artificial Intelligence Technical Committee.

Following the expressions of interest (EOI) FSO will establish a Technical Committee to provide expert advice, based on evidence, across educational and expert and/or technical knowledge to assist the design and development of training products.

Membership of the Technical Committee will be proportional to the scope of the project.

Technical Committee Meetings

December 2025 – October 2027

Technical Committee meetings will be held throughout the project to obtain subject matter expertise (SME) on the draft training products, provide industry advice and recommendations and support for FSO's Draft Training Package Products.

Notify Senior Responsible Officers (SROs), Assurance Body, and other Jobs and Skills Councils (JSCs)

May 2026

An email will be sent to SROs, the Assurance Body and other JSCs notifying them of the availability of the Consultation Strategy, Technical Committee Membership, and terms of reference (ToRs) on the FSO project website.

Drafting training package products process

Drafting training products

March 2026 – December 2026

Scoping and review of training package products involves the development of new and revised Specialist Artificial Intelligence training products within the ICT Training Package. This is a targeted specialist stream project, not a full Training Package review, and focuses on drafting new nationally endorsed AI training products, refining or superseding existing AI-related units where required, and ensuring alignment with ICT pathways and national reform settings.

Following the Scoping Report and advice provided from the Specialist Artificial Intelligence Technical Committee, FSO will commence writing the Training Package Products. These products will be reviewed and approved by the Technical Committee prior to the first Government and Public Consultation process.

Scoping will include consultation with stakeholders to inform these decisions.

Drafting consultation

Stakeholder engagement and collaboration will be open, proactive, inclusive, fair, and transparent across the Vocational Education and Training (VET) system and industry. Multiple mechanisms will be used to collect feedback to inform the development process including (but not limited to):

- Workshops
- Email Feedback
- Questionnaire

These are designed to maximise participation opportunities and gather a comprehensive range of views and perspectives from stakeholders across Australia.

FSO and its contractors will engage with members from the consultation group and a wider network of stakeholders to acquire feedback through various communications channels. These facilitated consultations give stakeholders an opportunity to discuss issues as a group and provide their feedback. This provides a rich source of information for TPD work and helps to determine consensus between stakeholders and divergent views.

For this project, stakeholders will have the ability to attend workshops, individual consultations and complete questionnaires. These activities will give stakeholders the ability to provide feedback on:

- The training design, including architecture and training product drafting
- The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) levels
- Impacts on RTOs, employers and learners
- Implementation issues and considerations.

Treatment of Feedback

Feedback captured during the drafting consultation period will be reviewed by the Technical Committee for relevance to the training product. The Technical Committee will use their expertise to analyse the feedback and identify which feedback is to be incorporated within the training products.

Where feedback is not incorporated, FSO will provide justification for exclusion.

Consultation Log

Throughout the development process, feedback will be captured in the project Consultation Log. The Consultation Log will include a high-level summary of feedback received and will be published to the

project website at key points. It will include evidence of consultations, responses to feedback, and if relevant any dispute resolution, justification for feedback not incorporated, and issues not resolved.

2. Public and Government Consultation

Release of draft training products

January 2027

The draft training products will be made available via FSOs project website page including consultation dates and options for providing feedback. The links on the project web page make all drafts publicly available to download for review and comment. The opening of consultation will be promoted through FSO newsletters, email alerts and social media, and reminders will be sent via the same mechanisms during the four-week consultation period.

Undertake public and government consultations

January 2027 – March 2027

Stakeholder engagement and collaboration will be open, proactive, inclusive, fair, and transparent across the VET system and industry. Multiple mechanisms will be used to collect feedback to inform the development process. These are designed to maximise participation opportunities and garner a comprehensive range of views and perspectives from stakeholders across Australia.

FSO will engage with members from the consultation group and a wider network of stakeholders to acquire feedback through various communications channels. These facilitated consultations give stakeholders an opportunity to discuss issues as a group and provide their feedback. This provides a rich source of information for TPD work and helps to determine consensus between stakeholders and divergent views.

Commonwealth and state/territory government stakeholders and their representatives will be invited to participate in webinar discussions.
Individual Consultations	FSO will hold individual consultations with key stakeholders to facilitate specialist feedback. These consultations allow for in-depth discussion on targeted topics that may be complex or where divergent views exist.
Questionnaires	FSO will provide questionnaires promoting feedback on the <i>Specialist Artificial Intelligence</i> Training Products. Questionnaires give the opportunity for a diverse

	range of stakeholders to provide feedback on draft products, it also assists in maximising reach to rural and remote stakeholders.
State and Territory Updates	FSO will hold individual state and territory feedback sessions to promote interactive discussion and gain feedback on the Specialist Artificial Intelligence Training Products. This gives the opportunity for state and territories to include their stakeholders in discussions and provide feedback on draft products.

Treatment of Feedback

Feedback captured during the Public and Government consultation period will be analysed and presented to the Technical Committee for review for relevance to the training product. The Technical Committee will use their expertise to analyse the feedback and identify which feedback is to be incorporated within the training products. Where feedback is not incorporated FSO will provide justification for exclusion.

Maintain a Consultation Log

July 2025 – October 2027

Throughout the development process, feedback will be captured in the project Consultation Log. The Consultation Log will include a high-level summary of feedback received and will be published to the project website at key points. It will include evidence of consultations, responses to feedback, and if relevant any dispute resolution, justification for feedback not incorporated, and issues not resolved.

3. Incorporating feedback

Determine revisions

March 2027 - April 2027

Information collated from consultations will be analysed to identify potential actions, responses and solutions. These actions, responses and solutions will be developed through regular facilitated processes including advice from the Technical Committee, and where necessary other subject matter experts. FSO will endeavour to incorporate feedback to ensure the final products reflect a shared RTO and industry view.

Technical Committee Statement

April 2027 – May 2027

The technical committee must review all training package products included in the submission. FSO receives confirmation statements from the technical committee that they have reviewed all the final draft training package products.

Additional consultation (if required)

May 2027

Additional consultation may be undertaken to manage diverse viewpoints or if significant changes have been made to the training product because of public and government consultation. Timeframes for any additional consultation will reflect the scope and complexity of the proposed changes.

Additional consultation process will be in line with [Undertake public and government consultations](#).

Provide justification

March 2027 – April 2027

Justification will be provided where consultation feedback is not implemented or broad consensus from stakeholders can not be reached, along with reasons why issues cannot be resolved. Any impact on learners and employment outcomes will be clearly identified.

Dispute resolution

April 2027 – June 2027

Where broad agreement cannot be achieved, FSO will engage with all relevant stakeholders to facilitate an outcome. Should a formal dispute be raised FSO will apply the Model Dispute Resolution Policy.
