Introduction

The demand for mortgage brokers in Australia has surged, with brokers facilitating 75% of all new residential loans in 2024, up from 57% in 2017.

At the same time, the industry landscape is evolving rapidly – compliance requirements are tightening, clients are requesting increasingly personalised advice, AI adoption is accelerating, and fresh opportunities are emerging in areas such as commercial lending and green finance.

Although 85% of mortgage brokers hold qualifications equal to or above diploma level, as identified in recent consultations for Future Skills Organisation's (FSO) Workplace Plan 2025, existing qualifications no longer reflect current industry practices. This has led to some employers developing their own training programs and internships, which has increased their costs.

This highlights the need for a coordinated, industry-informed update to maintain workforce capability and meet employer expectations.

Scope of the project

This project will update the Certificate IV in Finance and Mortgage Broking and the Diploma of Finance and Mortgage Broking Management along with related skill sets and units of competency (UoC) within the FNS TP to ensure they are current, relevant, and aligned with industry expectations.

An internal scoping review of the Certificate IV in Finance and Mortgage Broking and Diploma of Finance and Mortgage Broking Management will underpin the update. This scoping review will provide detailed information around the current state of the qualifications, assess the consultation information to-hand, and provide targeted recommendations to define the scope of updates, ensuring alignment with industry needs, workforce capability, and employer expectations.

1. Initial Development

Website notification

September 2025

FSO will publish the project commencement, consultation process, and feedback options on the FSO Project website [FNS Training Product \(TP\) Update: Cert IV / Diploma in Finance and Mortgage Broking - Future Skills Organisation](#).

Establishment of Technical Committee

December 2025 – November 2026

FSO will send an email to key stakeholders seeking nominations to become an FNS Training Product (TP) Update: Cert IV / Diploma in Finance and Mortgage Broking Technical Committee member.

Following the expressions of interest (EOI), FSO will establish a Technical Committee to provide expert advice, based on evidence, across educational and expert and/or technical knowledge to assist the design and development of training products.

Membership of the Technical Committee will be proportional to the scope of the project.

Drafting Training Package Products Process

Drafting Training Products

January 2026 – July 2026

Scoping and review of training package products involves analysing existing UoCs and skill sets to ensure currency and alignment with industry needs. This process includes identifying outdated content, duplication, and opportunities to integrate emerging technologies.

Scoping will include consultation with stakeholders to inform these decisions.

Drafting Consultation

Stakeholder engagement and collaboration will be open, proactive, inclusive, fair, and transparent across the Vocational Education and Training (VET) system and industry. Multiple mechanisms will be used to collect feedback to inform the development process including (but not limited to):

- Workshops
- Email Feedback
- Feedback Forms

These are designed to maximise participation opportunities and gather a comprehensive range of views and perspectives from stakeholders across Australia.

FSO and its contractors will engage with members from the consultation group and a wider network of stakeholders to acquire feedback through various communications channels. These facilitated consultations give stakeholders an opportunity to discuss issues as a group and provide their feedback. This provides a rich source of information for TPD work and helps to determine consensus between stakeholders and divergent views.

For this project, stakeholders will have the ability to attend workshops, individual consultations and to complete feedback forms. These activities will give stakeholders the ability to:

- provide input on training design, delivery and assessment
- comment on proposed Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) levels
- identify impacts on learners, and
- flag potential implementation issues

Treatment of Feedback

Feedback captured during the drafting consultation period will be reviewed by the Technical Committee for relevance to the training product. The Technical Committee will use their expertise to analyse the feedback and identify which feedback is to be incorporated within the training products.

Where feedback is not incorporated, FSO will provide justification for exclusion.

2. Public and Government Consultation

Release of the Draft Training Products

August 2026

The draft training products will be made available via FSOs project website page including consultation dates and options for providing feedback. The links on the project web page make all drafts publicly available to download for review and comment. The opening of consultation will be promoted through FSO newsletters, email alerts and social media, and reminders will be sent via the same mechanisms during the four-week consultation period.

Undertake Public and Government Consultations

August 2026

Stakeholder engagement and collaboration will be open, proactive, inclusive, fair, and transparent across the VET system and industry. Multiple mechanisms will be used to collect feedback to inform the development process. These are designed to maximise participation opportunities and garner a comprehensive range of views and perspectives from stakeholders across Australia.

These consultations allow for in-depth discussion on targeted topics that may be complex or where divergent views exist.
Feedback Forms	FSO will provide feedback forms promoting feedback on the FNS Training Product (TP) Update: Cert IV / Diploma in Finance and Mortgage Broking Training Products. Feedback forms give the opportunity for a diverse range of stakeholders to provide feedback on draft products; it also assists in maximising reach to rural and remote stakeholders.
State and Territory Updates	FSO will hold individual state and territory sessions to promote interactive discussion and gain feedback on the FNS Training Product (TP) Update: Cert IV / Diploma in Finance and Mortgage Broking Training Products. This gives the opportunity for state and territories to include their stakeholders in discussions and provide feedback on draft products.

Treatment of Feedback

Feedback captured during the Public and Government consultation period will be analysed and presented to the Technical Committee for review for relevance to the training product. The Technical Committee will use their expertise to analyse the feedback and identify which feedback is to be incorporated within the training products. Where feedback is not incorporated, FSO will provide justification for exclusion.

Maintain a Consultation Log

September 2025 – March 2027

Throughout the development process, feedback will be captured in the project Consultation Log. The Consultation Log will include a high-level summary of feedback received and will be published to the project website at key points. It will include evidence of consultations, responses to feedback, and if relevant any dispute resolution, justification for feedback not incorporated, and issues not resolved.

3. Incorporating Feedback

Determine revisions

September 2026

Information collated from consultations will be analysed to identify potential actions, responses, and solutions. These actions, responses and solutions will be developed through regular facilitated processes including advice from the Technical Committee, and where necessary other subject matter experts. FSO will endeavour to incorporate feedback to ensure the final products reflect a shared RTO and industry view.

Technical Committee Statement

October 2026

The Technical Committee must review all training package products included in the submission. FSO receives confirmation statements from the Technical Committee that they have reviewed all the final draft training package products.

Additional consultation (if required)

October 2026

Additional consultation may be undertaken to manage diverse viewpoints or if significant changes have been made to the training product because of public and government consultation. Timeframes for any additional consultation will reflect the scope and complexity of the proposed changes.

Additional consultation process will be in line with [Undertake public and government consultations](#).

Provide justification

November 2026

Justification will be provided where consultation feedback is not implemented or broad consensus from stakeholders can not be reached, along with reasons why issues cannot be resolved. Any impact on learners and employment outcomes will be clearly identified.

Dispute resolution

December 2026

Where broad agreement cannot be achieved, FSO will engage with all relevant stakeholders to facilitate an outcome. Should a formal dispute be raised FSO will apply the Model Dispute Resolution Policy.
